Program History >>>

The Alberta Youth Pheasant Program has operated for many years with the help and guidance of the Sarcee Fish & Game Association. In the past, this program has had as many as 100 students per year taking advantage of the course.

Each student learns shotgun patterns, clay pigeon shooting, safe gun control, and game cleaning. While hunting the released pheasants each young hunter is accompanied by a mentor to ensure proper gun control and safety. Dog handlers with well trained dogs are also in the field to flush the birds for the participants.

The young hunters gain first-hand knowledge of bird hunting with dogs and a respect for wildlife and habitat conservation.

The importance of trained, experienced and mentored hunters in the outdoors is paramount to good habitat conservation, proper game management, and safe enjoyable experiences in our great Canadian outdoors for future generations.

The Costs >>>

The average number of birds required is about 500 and these are raised and then released by Dan Radomsky on his farm near Innisfail.

Most often, young birds are purchased for \$8 each from suppliers.

A less expensive option is to purchase eggs and have the birds brooded in Olds.

Dan Radomsky receives about \$10 per acre for crops left unharvested for use with training the Alberta Youth Pheasant Program's participants.

Other costs for the Program to consider are the 4 tons of food required for the birds, priced at approximately \$300 per ton. As well, advertising in flyers and newspapers, and the signing of waivers costs about \$10 per student.

An additional \$300 is traditionally spent every December to thank the sponsors and the people who are involved with this enjoyable and very worthwhile Program.
