Introduction To the Academy

The Cenalta Youth Conservation Academy offers a unique experience for young people aged 12-15 years of age. Students must be 12 years of age by July 9, 2017.

It should prove not only to be educational, but offers the opportunity for meeting new friends and participating in many recreational activities.

Through film presentations, and small group activities, participants will examine the components of:

Firearm Safety and Handling

Basic safety, firearm theory, care and handling, practical - Small Bore And Trap, .22 Caliber, Black Powder And Shotgun.

Canadian Firearm Safety Course (Non Restricted) License Qualification Instruction and test.

Archery

Archery 1, General - This course is oriented to introduce the basic archery skills to the novice and acquaint the novice with the associated equipment and safety procedures.

Water Safety

Theory, safety equipment and application - some do's and don't's.

Open Canoe, Novice-An introductory course designed for people with little or no previous experience in the open Canadian canoe.

Practical - Canoe entries and exits, basic forward and reverse paddling, simple manoeuvres and turns by one person and by two people.

Capsizing and rescuing of open canoes by others.

Hunter Education

Wilderness Survival Skills - An introductory course dealing with the problems of survival in a wild environment. Techniques of fire lighting, shelter building, foraging, fishing, tool making and signaling are practiced.

The 2017 Youth Hunter Education Camp is a 5 day event of fun filled learning activities. Experts will be sharing their knowledge and providing instruction in the Alberta Conservation and Hunter Education Program, the Canadian Firearms Safety Course and much more. Upon successful completion of the appropriate exams, students will be certified in the Alberta Conservation and Hunter Education Program and the Canadian Firearms Program. They will then qualify to apply for their Wildlife Identification Number (WIN card) through any private license issuer and be able to apply for their Minor's Possession Licence for firearms.

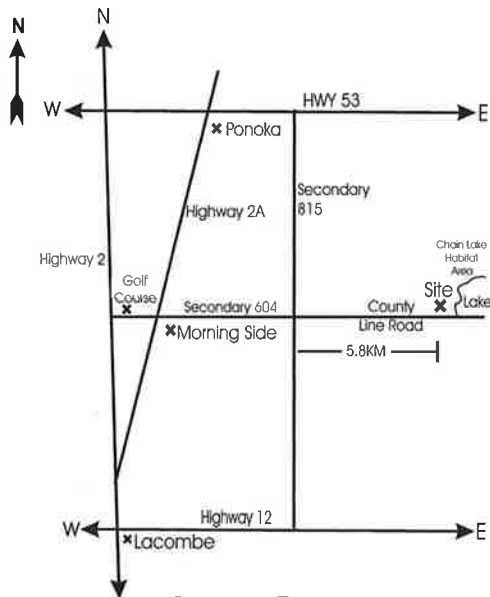
Meals

Arrival & Departure

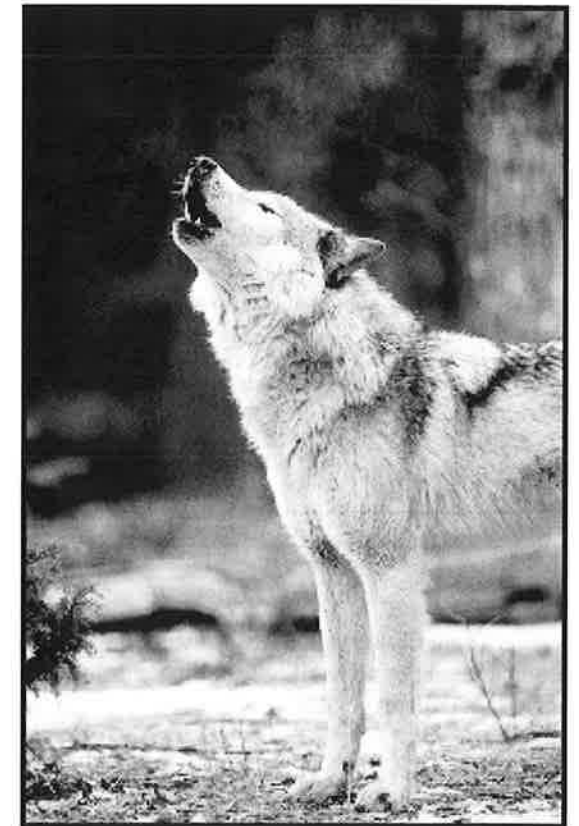
- Registration at camp from 1 to 2 p.m.
